## OVERALL OBJECTIVE

To strengthen youth resilience to online propaganda of violent extremist views in Kyrgyzstan.

## DIRECT BENEFICIARIES

**14-28** YEAR OLD YOUTH IN EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS AND YOUNG LABOR MIGRANTS **AND** PRACTITIONERS OF THE FIELD OF COUNTERING VIOLENT EXTREMISM

## OUTCOMES

1

Enhance the quality, selection of topics and impact of core narratives in educational and information resources, commissioned as part of the government program on countering violent extremism.

2

Strengthen the ability of youth audiences to recognize and critically assess online extremist content and propaganda.

## ACTIVITIES

1. *Initiation of a multi-sectoral practitioners working group for production and dissemination of a model video narratives in the country and develop effective narratives to CVE in multiple Internet-friendly formats.*

2. *After a skills gaps assessment of digital and media literacy competencies among youth (14-18 and 18-28), development of a digital and media literacy module on essential life skills. Pilot in 6 educational institutions.*

### ACHIEVED OUTPUTS

#### ACTIVITY 1

**105 VIDEO NARRATIVES** collected (produced in Kyrgyzstan since 2011 by 19 different organizations targeting youth, in Kyrgyz, Uzbek and Russian)

*Media Plan Guideline to promote project's video narratives and a more effective usage of digital media – developed*

*Segmentation exercise available to determine the access and impact of the counter narrative on the youth migrant workers and students*

**23 NARRATIVES** analyzed and report finalized

**5 MULTI-STAKEHOLDERS WORKING GROUP MEETINGS** held with 25 participants

*Storylines Narratives' Guideline and 10 storylines created*

**12 EXPERT SUB-WORKING GROUP MEETINGS** held

*1 video – To be Unified – created and disseminated*

#### ACTIVITY 2

**3465 OFFLINE RESPONDENTS**

*An assessment of the skills gaps conducted – in terms of digital and media literacy competencies.*

**5437 OVERALL USERS** registered in the online portal

*Two versions of digital and media literacy curriculum available for high school students (14–18 years old) and for university students and migrant workers (19–28 years old).*

**4803 SESSIONS** started on the online portal

*Each set consists of three modules:*

- 1. Concept of cybercrimes and online threats*
- 2. The use of internet for extremist and terrorist purposes*
- 3. Online safety methods*

**3405 SESSIONS** completed on the portal

*An educator toolkit is developed in Russian, Kyrgyz, and Uzbek languages.*

**42 TEACHERS** received a ToT training on the curriculum

*Beyond the planned 6 schools, the Curriculum will be piloted by the State Commission for Religious Affairs along with Religious Studies in 56 schools across the country.*
